### **DIVISIONAL REPORTS JUNE 2022- JUNE 2023**

This newsletter reflects the report of activities carried out by the Councillor of the Norman Gardens Division, Jacqueline Lewis, from June 2022 to June 2023. Importantly, the newsletter is intended to provide an annual update of the main issues of concerns of the communities of Harbour Heights, Rennock Lodge, Poker Flat, Johnson Town, Pleasant Heights, Norman Gardens, Burger Community and Rollington Town.

#### **COUNCILLOR'S REMARKS**

Let me use this opportunity to thank all residents of the Norman Gardens Division. I am truly humbled by the confidence you continue to place, and I am indeed honored to be serving for a fourth year as your representative in the KSAMC. You have my unwavering commitment to advocate for those issues that will faithfully reflect your priorities and for the improvement of our quality of life, as well as the sustained development of our community. This report reflects my efforts during this period.

I remain committed to being inclusive, ensuring that we have regular community meetings and that the issues discussed are followed up on, and that plans made are implemented.

From our ongoing discussions, it is clear that among the **issues** that still need to be addressed are: *increasing employment opportunities*; *keeping our streetlights working*; *improving the plaguing water crisis*; *ensuring that our community is sanitary and safe*; as well as to *continue to repairing and maintaining our roads*. I extend a distinctive word of gratitude to our MP, Mr. Phillip Paulwell for continuing the tradition of a great collaborative partnership resulting in prolific effects from our combined efforts.

**Divisional Organization** The Norman Garden's Division maintained a recognized status under the watchful eyes of Councillor Jacqueline Lewis. The division remains politically vibrant and relevant under the current leadership. The Councillor enjoys the full support of the executive team navigated by comrade chairman Peter Young. The division continues to convey its regular monthly meeting at 6 Cheriton Road and would like to take this opportunity to say a big thank you to comrade Paul Burke for his accommodations and generosity in allowing us to host our divisional meetings sometimes without due notice, at no financial obligation. The Division currently has twenty-two (22) functional groups. The current group servicing requires greater improvement going forward, it is imperative for some group members and chairmen to move away from the dependency syndrome of the Councillor paying for their groups whenever they go in abeyance, instead to ensure that chairmen of groups hold regular group meetings, maintain and pay for their own future group dues.

**Enumeration & Canvassing** A special enumeration committee was convened to bolster the enumeration process in the division. The committee is spearheaded by Marlon Johnson and Comrade Paul Works who is also in charge of electoral matters in the division. Canvassing is an ongoing project with the goal to ensure that the entire Division is fully covered.

## **Education and Training Initiatives**

The focus on education and training continue to be an important hallmark of Councillor Lewis effort, in ensuring that our children and youths are prepared to make the most of learning opportunities and have a chance at upward social mobility. MP Paulwell along with Councillor Lewis continues to assist with back to school assistance with approximately 400 persons receiving scholarship and grants during the period. Students were assisted with the purchase of school books, the payment of tuition fees.

This year we seek to get as many persons as possible enrolled in training programs offered by various institutions and promote those that are being offered to our community. So far one hundred and twenty (120) unattached youth have enrolled in HEART Trust NTA Skills training program, eighty from Harbour Height, forty from Rennock Lodge We are still encouraging persons to apply for the Registered for skills training and Skills Certification Program.

In this regard we must commend: the Rockfort HEART TRUST NTA and Delaware State University (DSU) local representative, Dr. Kornel Brown for significantly helping to drive educational initiatives across the division. I would also like to specially recognize the Harbour Heights Citizen Committee and the Rollington Town Community Development Committee as these two groups continue to lead the way in building participatory community leadership and harnessing community expertise in the implementation of projects. ## **Reading across Jamaica Day**

Read across Jamaica Day saw Councillor Jacqueline Lewis reading at the Rennock Lodge All Age School. A total of fifty reading books and educational Martials were donated to various schools. Thanks to all our parents and members who visited a school of their choice and joined in this initiative to promote the pleasure of reading. We encourage those who were unable to do so to make a special effort in 2024. ## **Employment Opportunities**

Let me thank those companies in the Division that continue to employ persons who live in the communities. The M.P and Councillor continue to promote those opportunities of which they are aware. In addition we are happy to report on the following:

1.Farm Work - a total of 10(5 per year) overseas employment application forms were distributed to individuals within the Division. All have been submitted to the Ministry of labor. Eight (8) people were successful in the selection process.

2.Christmas Work Program - Over 420 persons were mobilized in December 2023 to clean verges, bush open spaces and paint of kerb walls. This provided an opportunity for temporary employment of laborers, persons operating whackers and trucks providing garbage removal.


3.Summer Employment Program - a total of 30 applications were submitted for summer employment offered by both the Member of Parliament and the National Youth Service. These programs employ students from the secondary and tertiary levels providing well needed work experience and back to school assistance.

4.Short Term Poverty Reduction Program - 45 persons from the Norman Gardens Division benefitted from grants awarded by the Member of Parliament. These grants are meant to improve entrepreneurship in the Division and to lower unemployment. Based on feedback, it is recommended that some follow up be done with recipients to monitor the success rate of the economic activities undertaken by individuals.

5.Bee Keeping – Five YO members received 5 - 10 bees' boxes each as an alternate entrepreneurial activity. This venture was possible with the partnership with the Jamaica 4 H club.

#### **Economic and Welfare**

Over 350 packages, sponsored by the Member of Parliament, were distributed to Shut Ins by the Councillor and her Executive Team.

Our annual Easter program this year included buns for 100 persons.

#### Improving our infrastructure

In keeping with the desire of residents for a clean, safe and thriving community, Councillor Jacqueline Lewis and MP Paulwell have combined their efforts and have been able to complete several improvements to roads in the division rehabilitation parts of Hillside Crescent.

Under the KSAMC DAF program Hillside Crescent got a total rehabilitation and several others repaired: those repaired are as follows

-Kensington Road. -Norman Terrace

-Range Crescent -Waterloo Road

-Cartridge Road

We are however conscious of the fact that there is need for repairs on several others and will continue our vigorous advocacy for others to be repaired.


# **Drain Cleaning**




